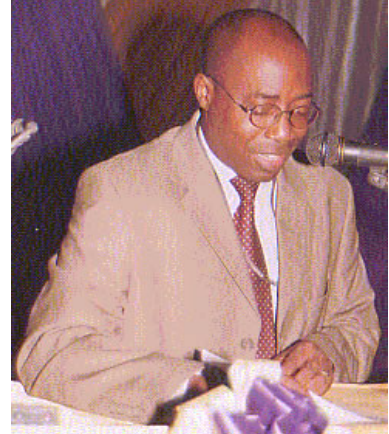

Akinrinádé è autore di molteplici pubblicazioni: tre volumi -*Locating the Local in the Global: Voices on a Globalised Nigeria* (Faculty of Arts, OAU, Ife, 2004), *Africa in the Post-Cold War International System* (London and Washington: Cassell, 1998) ed *Economic Development in Africa* (London and New York: Pinter & Columbia University Press, 1987)-, tre monografie ed oltre 50 articoli editi all’interno di libri oppure di riviste internazionali.

Il prof. Akinrinádé è componente dei comitati editoriali di diverse riviste internazionali, tra cui il “Journal of Contemporary African Studies”, ed è affiliato a diverse associazioni professionali, nazionali ed internazionali.

Solá Akinrinádé, since August 2003, is Dean of the Faculty of Arts of the Obafemi Awolowo University, Ile-Ife, Nigeria, where he is, also, Professor of History (Political and Diplomatic History of Africa) and International Relations.

Dr. Akinrinádé’s research has concentrated on understanding the dynamics of African foreign and security policies including foreign policy cooperation, sub-regional security cooperation in West Africa, and the impact of sectarian and other forms of diversity on foreign and security policies of African states. He has published widely in his areas of research. His publications include three books, Locating the Local in the Global: Voices on a Globalised Nigeria (Faculty of Arts, OAU, Ife, 2004), Africa in the Post-Cold War International System (London and Washington: Cassell, 1998) and Economic Development in Africa (London and New York: Pinter & Columbia University Press, 1987); three monographs and over fifty articles in learned international journals and chapters in books.

He has served, and currently serves on the editorial board of leading international journals in his discipline including the “Journal of Contemporary African Studies”. He is a member of several national and international professional associations.
